About The College...

With the shift of the capital of Assam from Shillong to Dispur, the city of Guwahati witnessed tremendous growth of population and expansion. But the facilities for higher education still remained virtually limited as the existing colleges in the city failed to cater the need to accommodate a proportionately large number of students and as a result, many students found their doors closed to their aspirations of getting higher education.

The realisation of this fact and the deep understanding of the situation convinced Late Tholok Gogoi of the prospects of founding a college in 1988. He was the General Secretary of the All Assam Other Backward Classes Association, the Mantri of the Assam Rastrabhasa Prachar Samitee and a devoted social worker all throughout his life. Politically a devoted socialist, socially christ to the people, late Gogoi started the college at the O.B.C. Complex Dispur.

But his dream-child was ailing from its very birth due to dire financial constraints and it could just make it bare existence till 1992 without the basic infrastructures of the land and building. Then like a saviour a man behind the scene appeared. He was none other than Late Hiteswar Saikia, the then Chief Minister of Assam. A man of the masses, Late Saikia was a versatile person and being an educationist himself in his early career as the Vice-Principal of Gargaon College, could realise the necessity

of establishing a college in the south-eastern part of the city. And therefore, he promptly allotted a plot of land to the college at Sixmile during his tenure as Chief Minister of Assam.

Subsequently a new Governing body was formed under the Presidentship of Dr. Herio Prava Saikia an educationist and former Cabinet Minister of Assam. Under her able guidance, the college has been Progressing fast.

While the college has been marching with glory and pride, the family of Late Uma Charan Bania, Former Joint Commissioner, Sales Tax & Member of APSC, came forward with the proposal of building a state-of-the-art Library in his memory. Now the college can take the pride of having a well-equipped modern library named after him.

The college is renamed as Karmashree Hiteswar Saikia College, in the fond memory of the founder patron of the college and former Chief Minister of Assam Late Hiteswar Saikia, in public meeting held on 4th Jan., 2004, with eminent scholars, educationist, social workers, politicians and many other prominent citizens of greater Guwahati.

The college is, thus a fast growing Co-educational institution with Arts and Commerce Stream, located at an ideal place near Sixmile on the Panjabari Road, Guwahati-22. The atmosphere here is quiet, presenting a serene educational environment.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

Uma Charan Bania Memorial Library and Education Centre

The College library has adequate number of text books and reference materials which can be borrowed by students on production of identity card. A student can borrow two books at a time for 15 days. Books may be re-issued for another 15 days. A late fine of Rs. 2.00 shall be lived per day for 15 days and thereafter Rs. 5.00 per day till the date of return. The library remains open from 9.30 am to 4 pm in all working days. Books are issued from 10 to 3 pm. The college library has the internet facilities for students and for research purpose. The library is digitalised.

STUDENTS' UNION

The College Students' Union is the general body of the students of the college. Its membership is compulsory for every student. The office bearers of the Union body are elected annually.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The college lays great emphasis on discipline and character building of the students. A student, if found guilty of disobeying college rules, will have to face strict disciplinary action which includes expelling from the college/rusticated for a period/debarred from appearing in any examination for one or more years etc. Such disciplinary action will be decided by the Disciplinary Committee headed by the Principal and her decision shall be final in all such matters.
2. All forms of ragging in the college campus are strictly prohibited. Any one found indulging in ragging will be firmly dealt with disciplinary action.
3. Any violation of college rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, non clearance of college dues, discourtesy to faculty members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination will be dealt strictly.
4. Any notice desired to be put up or circulated to students in the college campus will require the prior approval of the college authority.
5. Use of mobile phone in the class room is strictly prohibited.
6. Students who do not attend atleast 75% of total classes held in an academic year are not allowed to appear in any examination. This applies to all the subjects both Major & General.
7. Students must attend all the sessional examinations failing which he/she shall not be allowed to appear in G.U. Final Examination.
8. Students along with their Parents/Guardians are requested to be present in the Orientation Day that is to be observed on the 1st day of the new session.
9. The course of study in the college is full time course. So, no students is allowed to pursue any other course of study simultaneously in another institution.
10. The college is a tobacco free zone. Use of tobacco in the college premises is strictly prohibited.

IDENTITY CARDS

A non-transferable identity Card will be issued to every student at the time of admission. The students are required to keep the identity cards with them during college hours and have to be produced whenever demanded for. Identity cards are issued annually.

GUARDIAN PARTICIPATION

All guardians should keep contact with the Principal and keep track of the academic progress of their wards. Constructive suggestions from the guardians are most welcome at any time, and they are requested to attend parent-teacher meet organised by every department of the college from time to time.
