The college is renamed as Karmashree Hiteswar Saikia College, in the fond memory of the founder patron of the college and former Chief Minister of Assam Late Hiteswar Saikla, in public meeting held on 4th Jan., 2004, with eminent scholars, educationist, social workers, politicians and many other prominent citizens of greater Guwahati.

STUDENTS UNION

The College Students' Union is the general body of the students of the college. Its membership is compulsory for every student. The office bearers of the Union body are elected annually.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The course of study in the college is full time course. So, no students is allowed to pursue any other course of study simultaneously in another institution.
